1. My Summer Reading Book

Write the title and the author on the first page. Draw a picture from the beginning of the story on the next page. Next, draw a picture from the middle of the story. Last, draw a picture from the end of the story. Have students write in why she/he liked the story.

Or

Write new vocabulary words (words that you did not know- Ex. Excited) and draw a picture. Put a new word and a picture on each page. You should have five new words.

2. Make a poster about one of the books. Highlight important information such as the setting, characters, vocabulary, main idea etc.

Your child will receive a Summer Reading Certificate and Nachos if they complete one of the activities. Your child will be better prepared for the increasing complexity of Louisiana's new Common Core standards if you work with them over the summer to help them retain reading and math skills taught in first grade.
